Over the last few months, Imani Radio Uganda has experienced tremendous developments. These has been made possible by the great participation of Imani management and various partners, who have tirelessly played key roles through their prayers and giving to the cause of this ministry. The acquisition of the new transmitter has really worked wonders in our broadcasting. We are nearly reaching a half of Uganda's populace. The strength of our signal has also improved significantly in all regions that lie within our coverage area. Regions like Lang'o, Acholi, Busoga, Bukeddi and parts of Western Uganda that were not covered can now receive our signal loud and clear. With this increase in the listenership, we look forward to broadcasting the good news of our Lord Jesus and play a major role in changing and transforming people's lives through The Word.

The current location of our studio has been a challenge to listeners and partners who desire to physically reach us, but because of the road that is impassable during rainy season and dusty in dry period; the ministry has acquired land near Kapchorwa town where a studio is being constructed. Work is almost complete and perhaps in a month, we will be able to relocate. Final touches are being done as we await the Uganda Communications Commission to approve and allocate us with an STL frequency.

With our full power broadcasting,, we are now greatly impacting lives of our listeners across many regions in Uganda. We have received testimonies from various people who have experienced the Lord's doing in their lives through Imani. Many testimonies of what the Lord is doing in people's lives are still flowing in, thus making it evident that in deed God is working in and through this ministry in ways that we cannot understand.

In all these, we give glory and honor to our Lord, because it is by His doing that we have managed to achieve all these; not by human might nor power – *ONLY His GRACE*!. We look forward to seeing what God would have us accomplish now and in the future for everything is in His hands.

God had given my son a new heart. The plans I had to sell my belongings in order to fund his treatment, as well a fundraiser that I had called was called off. Today, my son is alive and kicking, healthy and schooling just like any other child without any complaint of any aching in any part of his body.
